Contract Bargaining Heating Up

The Unit 9 PECG Bargaining Team met with DPA Director Ron Yank and his staff on February 1 to attempt to negotiate a new MOU or labor contract for Unit 9 with Governor Brown's Administration. Follow up meetings with DPA are scheduled for February 14th followed by a meeting between DPA and the PECG Supervisory Meet and Confer Team on February 16 to discuss the continuing salary inequity for supervisors who did not receive the 10% raise paid to the Bargaining Unit in 2008.

Thank you to all who provided input in the San Diego Section sponsored contract negotiation survey back in November of last year. Your input is invaluable and was presented to the PECG Bargaining Team by VP Rank and File (Collective Bargaining) Robert Lumahan in Sacramento for their consideration.

With the Governor asking that a State Budget be in place by **March 1**st. We should know fairly soon where we stand through the end of this fiscal year; as well as, going into the upcoming one.

What happens beyond that will be determined by the results of our PECG Bargaining Team's collective bargaining efforts.

CalPERS Facts at a Glance

CalPERS is a "defined benefit" retirement plan for state, school, and many local agency employees. It provides benefits based on a member's years of service, age, and highest average compensation.

Benefits are also provided for disability and death (survivors/beneficiaries).

The total membership consists of **1.6** million members with **31%** of those being state employees. The remaining members consist of School and Local Agency employees.

As of **February 14th**, **2011** the CalPERS Fund had a market value of **\$ 229.5 billion**. The total rate of return for 2010 was **12.5%**.

There are currently just over **500,000** retirees, beneficiaries and survivors receiving an average monthly allowance of **\$2,220** each. Retirees' average years of service are **20.2 years** with an average retirement age of **60 years**.

It also manages the health benefits for nearly **1.3 million** members.

Benefits paid out in 2010 were approx \$13 billion. (from: http://www.calpers.ca.gov/)
